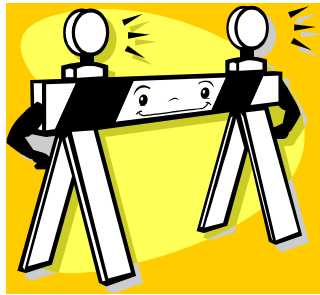

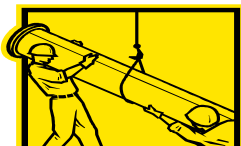
Join us as we build for the future CSHET 2010 Fall Networking Meeting
